Does a positive ("pass") assessment result offer an edge in terms of placement?

96% of the placed candidates passed their assessment test, while the figure for candidates who were not reported placed is 21 percentage points lower (75%). Additionally, there is a difference of 13 percentage points for failed candidates

The chart shown above is based on an analysis of a database of trainees under PMKVY (Short-Term Training) as of 3rd February, 2020. Out of 33.6 lakh candidates who were trained, the assessment results (Pass/Fail/Not Appeared) of 32.8 lakh candidates were reported in SDMS, and 15.3 lakh were placed.









MONTHLY DASHBOARD April 2020
